Job Description

Position Overview:

The World Youth Alliance Asia Pacific Regional Director (RD) reports directly to the President and supervises the regional staff. The RD is responsible for the implementation of the strategic plan at the regional level in accordance with WYA's Vision, Mission, and Charter. This position requires dedication to new membership growth and development, and maintains relations with current members, donors, friends, partners and other key contacts. The RD leads the region in advocacy on related issues.

Responsibilities:

- Develops and implements an annual operational plan with attainable goals for the areas of WYA focus in Membership, Education, Advocacy, and Culture.
- Engages regularly with active members to discuss progress, challenges, and innovative ideas, providing leadership and guidance in support of WYA's mission.
- Actively seeks opportunities to promote WYA through attendance and/or public speaking at conferences, seminars, schools, youth events, and other events.
- Leads growth, sustainability and expansion of WYA projects, events and programs.
- Be available to meet with donors, friends, and key contacts of WYA at the request of the President.
- Keep updated with regional issues and actively addresses policy related concerns of members and the general public with the Director of Policy and Research.

Requirements:

The WYA Asia Pacific RD should possess an undergraduate education, exceptional organizational and leadership skills, and have completed WYA foundational training. Strong communication and networking abilities are essential, along with the capability to effectively train and mentor team members. The successful candidate will be a self-starter, and able to work independently to accomplish significant projects within complex systems. This is an in-person role based in Manila, Philippines offering a unique opportunity to contribute to WYA's regional growth.
